

## OUTLOOKS

Introduce a situation or issue and brainstorm ideas in small groups or as a class.

When brainstorming, anything goes.

Consider perspectives such as:

- What might this look like at another time in the past or in the future?
- What might it look like in rural areas as opposed to cities?
- Who is affected?
- How does it affect them?
- What is being done to support them?
- Who cares?

Once there have been a number of outlooks brainstormed, select one to prepare a presentation to share with the class. Make it fun.

With the class sitting in a circle, one student from each group at a time shares their outlook on the situation or issue.

After the presentations, individually or in small groups, reflect on what you have learned on our differing perspectives of the situation or issue.
